Question:

Do we need Project Management COE or CoP in the world of AI?

Answer:

There is a place for both of these bodies in today's Al-infused world. There is a good case for some organizations to have both a Project Management CoE and a CoP. The CoE can provide the structure, standards, and expert guidance required, while the CoP can offer a more informal space for sharing insights and staying adaptable. The value brought by adopting a CoE, a CoP, or potential flavors of both should always align with an organization's specific needs, culture, and the scale of Al projects being undertaken.

Question:

What should we opt for: Project Management CoE or CoP?

Answer:

The choice between a CoE or a CoP depends on what the organization is trying to achieve. If it's a case of needing to standardize/centralize or create more structure around an organization's delivery, then a Centre of Excellence works better than a Community of Practice. For example where an organization has undergone significant growth or disruption (e.g. in a merger/acquisition situation), and more control is required. A CoP is most useful in organizations where creativity and learning from joint wisdom are paramount. Again, this depends on several factors such as organizational culture, industry sector, types of projects, project management maturity, and risk profile to name a few.

What should we opt for: Project Management CoE or CoP?

Answer:

The advantage of a CoE for an organization is in its ability to give standards and best practices with contextualized institutional memory. In a CoE deliberate attention is paid to developing project management skills within the organization and there is an emphasis on continual learning in depth which will sharpen subject matter experts. CoPs will enhance the experience of project managers more broadly. A dynamic community of project managers with multiple interests and experiences offers a holistic experience and allows knowledge sharing with cross-cutting themes and diversity. Communities will remove silos but still allow those with similar interests to go deeper in their fields. The question of which to opt for ultimately depends on the context and current needs for the project manager. A CoP will have clear benefits for any project manager. While CoEs are powerful some project managers may never have access to them.

Question:

Do we need Project Management COE or CoP in the world of AI?

Answer:

The benefits of AI to Project Management are undeniable. AI has managed to enhance functions such as data collection, tracking, and reporting. AI has been particularly useful for CoEs with the emergence of AI CoEs which use machine learning to make powerful data-driven decisions. AI will continue to grow and be more relevant and project managers must understand AI and all the fundamental concepts to fully harness its power and understand how to ride the wave. In this case, the limitations of AI are more important to understand in unpacking its relevance. There are some aspects of the social interactions around CoPs that AI can not replace. AI has also been shown to have its own biases, as it essentially learns from what it is fed

Do we need Project Management COE or CoP in the world of AI?

Answer:

Al is a companion – an assistant, for example, to brainstorm about a new topic. However, I do not use AI for confidential information (to my organization). There are knowledge and ways of working specific to organizations. Perhaps there is a new tool, technology, or service to be deployed that I will need in my project. I will reach out to a CoE to find out more. Even if we are in the age of AI, I still value human experiences: the same situation can be perceived and analyzed differently by different people. A conversation with a colleague in one of these communities can lead me to discover a new course. I will ask follow-up questions. I can also see how best practice learned through the communities helps my colleagues to improve. Both types of communities give new and diverse perspectives (and even more varied if they are global). More importantly, these communities help us connect with colleagues and peers. New solutions, collaborations, and even new businesses can emerge through community exchanges. And that is, for me, their most significant value.

Question:

What should we opt for: Project Management CoE or CoP?

Answer:

CoEs and CoPs aim to share knowledge and best practices – expertise for CoEs, and ideas for CoPs – and, I would add, to help leaders expand their networks and remain curious. But they are organized in different ways, in my experience. CoEs are structured and led by full-time employees, while volunteers run CoPs. Choosing between CoEs and CoPs depends on the below criteria: The level of expertise within the organization on the topic. If project management is not yet mature, the organization can begin with a CoP and add a CoE later. The size and complexity of the organization. If you are a small organization, you will not have the resources to have two communities. Begin with a CoP. The organization's goals. If the organization wants to gain specific expertise in project management (to get new businesses or sell services), then a CoE will help.

Answer:

In essence, the CoP and CoE are in place to provide a value of some sort, pursuit of excellence and knowledge sharing for organizations, and even a personal sense of belonging, especially for CoP. In this regard, organizations should opt for a model that fits their needs and helps them achieve their organizational goals. Depending on the size and their understanding of the Project management principle and processes, I would suggest starting with the CoP, as it is often less formal. Once the organization is fully staffed with personnel with skill and knowledge, it can set a CoE that is more structured and organized to lead improvements, develop best practices, and drive excellence.

Question:

Do we need Project Management COE or CoP in the world of AI?

Answer:

Absolutely! Ironically, the Student Prep Book published by PMI in January 2021 put humans or people at the center of the project endeavor, and rightfully so! However, with the evolution of technology, project managers can benefit from AI as a "buddy" or a close friend. 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
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
